# Morning Lesson

## LUKE: DON'T QUIT 2 Tim. 4:9-11

#### INTRO:

- 1. Have you ever been in a situation where you felt like the best option, the only option, you had was to quit?
- 2. Have you ever been in a friendship that you felt you had to quit?
- 3. As we look at the relationship of Luke and Paul, maybe we can learn something about how to not quit when a friendship gets tough.

#### I. THEY WERE DIFFERENT NATIONALITIES

- A. Paul was a Jew. Phil. 3:4-6; Acts 22:1-3
- B. Luke was a Gentile. Col. 4:10-14
- C. Paul and Luke managed to do more than co-exist. Col. 4:14
- D. Paul was not interested in people's race; he was interested in their soul—therein lies the key to overcoming any type of barrier in a relationship. **Phil. 3:7, 8**

#### II. THEY WERE FELLOW WORKERS.

- A. Paul identified Luke as such. Philemon 23, 24
- B. Luke is only mentioned three times in the New Testament. Col. 4:14; 2 Tim. 4:11; Phile. 24
  - 1. Luke was content to work in the background with Paul in the limelight.
  - He helped keep Paul going.
     Cor. 11:22–29; 2 Cor.12:7-9
  - 3. God sent angels to comfort Jesus in the garden, maybe he sent an earthly angel named Luke to Paul.

    Luke22:43

### CONC:

- 1. When we are faced with difficulty in our lives, we need to remember Dr. Luke and don't quit.
- 2. Maybe we are the "angel" . . . a messenger of God's good news of salvation!
