- 2. King Saul went from humble to greedy, powerful, and unfaithful to the Lord.1 Samuel 13:14
- 3. King David was the man after God's own heart and was always with the Lord.
- 4. King of all Jesus Christ the savior the one who delivers from the evil pleasures of the Lord.
- I. Who am I: Saul king of Israel
 - A. When Saul was first anointed king he was humble
 - 1. 1 Samuel 9:19-27 and 10:17-27
 - B. When Saul got into his reign he focused on the trophies of this world like power and wealth (1 Sam 15)
 - C. Saul paid with his life because he was more focused on the pleasure of this world than the Lord.
 - 1. 1 Sam. 28:19; Leviticus 20:6; 1 Cor. 10:13
 - 2. (Matt. 26:14-15; 27:1-5)
- II. Who am I: David king of Israel
 - A. David's priority was always on God even against wild animals and giants (1 Sam. 17:26, 34-36, 41-49)
 - B. David realized his sin with Bathsheba and turned from it (2 Sam. 12:1-14)
 - C. David is recognized as faithful and was looked at as a great person by the Jews even in Jesus's time because he walked with the Lord (Matt. 12:1-7)
- III. Who am I: Jesus Christ savior of the world and king of all
 - A. Jesus was the epidemy of humbleness (Phil. 2:5ff)
 - B. Jesus delivered us from the pleasure of this world so that we might have hope with him.
